

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ABOUT WATOTO WASOME

Watoto Wasome is a nonprofit organization that seeks to address the problem of low literacy levels among under-served children aged 3-10 years in Kenya. Our mission is fueled by the urgent need to bridge the alarming gap between children's actual literacy attainment and the expected grade-level standards.

We harness the transformative potential of child-centred learning, along with our unique access to children in underserved communities. We proudly collaborate with passionate directors and the government to improve children's literacy levels within the country.

Guided by the 2030 Sustainability Development Goal, we are dedicated to implementing ethical, accountable and effective programs that improve literacy rates in Kenya.

Thus far, we have onboarded over 150 children into our literacy programs. All children onboarded have not only learned foundational literacy but also improved their confidence and learned other life skills that will help them navigate through life.

We have taken over 6 centres under our wings and collaborated with teachers and caregivers to ensure that our children reach the stipulated literacy goals. In achieving this, we have had over 30 volunteers come on board to help us improve literacy in underserved communities since inception.

In 2023, we have been privileged to see the most genuine smiles on the faces of the children we worked with which embodies one of our core principles 'A foundation of love.'. These smiles have accompanied amazing progress in the literacy levels of the children marking some of our greatest achievements.

We have seen the 5-year-old girl who can now confidently identify letter sounds despite being diagnosed with a learning disability and the 9-year-old who can finally join the sounds "m-a-x" to read "max" and wants to disrupt other classes to show all teachers that he can now read. Seeing how much this has boosted their confidence and self-esteem has been wonderful. Our organization has grown and introduced new programs that continue to help children not only learn to read but enjoy reading. The birth of our reading program "Kusoma Kunabamba', meaning 'Reading is Fun' has been a major highlight for us. This program



aims to increase children's access to engaging, child-centred storybooks, improve reading fluency and comprehension, build their confidence and foster a genuine love for books.

As we gear up for 2024, we hope to improve the literacy of more children in underserved communities, gift them with their first self-owned storybook, and add even more smiles to their faces! None of this would have been possible without support from our well-wishers, supporters and silent donors. We are extremely grateful and we continue to hope that they will walk this journey with us.

As we reflect on Watoto Wasome's journey throughout 2023, we are fueled with immense pride and gratitude. This past year has been a testament to our team's unwavering dedication, the boundless resilience of the communities we serve, and the steadfast support we receive from people who believe in our mission

In 2023, we embarked on a journey fueled by our commitment to improving literacy one letter sound at a time, breaking barriers to education and fostering sustainable change in the lives of the children enrolled in our programs. Last year, we enrolled over 150 children in our programs. Furthermore, we have had over 30 volunteers dedicate their time to teach children and help us reduce the literacy gaps in different communities in Kenya.

Our significant strides would not have been possible without the incredible support from our donors, volunteers and partners. Their generosity, dedication, and unwavering belief in our mission have been the driving force behind every success story and transformative milestone we've celebrated this past year.



We added Makimei Children's home in Gitaru under our wing. All year we have improved literacy in the kids aged 3-10 years within the home

Through donations acquired, we bought more books and grew our library. More books mean kids get to interact with books individually.

We added gadgets to our library that help facilitate our literacy programs. Some of these gadgets include a portable projector and 2 tablets.

Launched our inaugural program dubbed 'Kusoma Kunabamba'. The program did its first pilot at Becky's school with Grade 3 students.



OUR PROGRAMS



Foundational Literacy interventions

We directly work with children who are below their expected grade level using child-centred activities and also start with the young ones to ensure they have a proper literacy foundation. We further divide the classes to ensure our learning meets the direct needs of the children ensuring dedicated attention and improvement.

Kusoma Kunabamba

We have launched a program whose aim is to increase children's access and interaction with engaging storybooks, increasing reading fluency, vocabulary and comprehension. The program is currently being piloted with Grade 3 children at Becky's school, Kibra.





Volunteer Program

We work with volunteers who take time to plan and attend our Sunday literacy and art activities. Through capacity-building activities, our volunteers take ownership of our learning initiatives ensuring all children are taught at the right level and closely monitoring their progress.






OUR 2023 IMPACT

Literacy Growth within the 4-6 Year Old Children


We measure our impact by ensuring evaluations are done regularly by the team. Within the 4-6 year old children, an improvement was seen. Our key measuring markers included


- Correct pencil grip
- Sound identification (audio)
- Sound Identification (visual)



Initially, at first assessment, most children in this class had no working knowledge of letters. They could neither identify nor sound them despite already being admitted to school. Our team came up with a literacy program tailored to their direct needs, The program incorporated many letter games that allowed the children to not only visualise but also sound out the letters 'a', 'b' and 'c'.

Our last assessment done in December 2023 revealed tremendous growth in the children. All children within the program achieved more than 50% improvement. Outside of literacy improvement, concentration was improved and their confidence was elevated. Our programs not only focus on literacy but also instil fundamental life skills.










Literacy Growth within the 6 - 9 Year Old Children

We measure our impact by ensuring evaluations are done regularly by the team. Within the 6 - 8 year old children, an improvement was seen. Our key measuring markers included

- Letter sound identification
- Blending two-letter words
- Blending of three-letter words



This group's literacy program aimed to address the challenges faced after assessment. Our initial tests revealed a clear struggle to identify sounds and blend two-letter words. None of the children could blend three-letter words. Over the course of the literacy program, strides were made in the growth of the children, By the end all participants achieved commendable proficiency in blending two-letter words showcasing their enhanced grasp of foundational literacy skills.

The most notable achievement was observed in their ability to blend three-letter words While initially, none of the children could successfully blend three-letter words, by the conclusion an impressive 86% improvement was recorded.

Last year, Watoto Wasome spent a total of ksh.269,965. The year's spend included the purchase of story books for the children, buying of snacks that are given to the children after every session, among other items that will help aid in the learning process, storage for story books, printing services for various activities, running of the website and administration charges. The total amount was raised by our generous well-wishers throughout the year and the fulfilled pledges from the 2022 Annual Fundraiser

In 2024, we are expanding our programs to new horizons. As per our projections, we shall need Kshs 576,000 to facilitate our work. Our regular literacy programs and their facilitations take up 70% of this budget while our new program 'Kusoma Kunabamba' will take up 10% of the program. 20% of the budget will go into supporting our superstar volunteer team.
